- 1. A meeting of the State Level High Power Steering Committee (HPSC) for the review and approval of Smart City Proposal of **Srinagar city** was held under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary (Chairman HPSC) in the Meeting Hall 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, Civil Secretariat, Jammu on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2017 at 2.00 PM.

- 3. The Commissioner/Secy. H&UDD informed that this meeting of SLHPSC has been convened to discuss improved Smart City Proposal (SCP) of **Srinagar City** which has already been discussed in the last meeting held on 13.12.2017. The Smart City Proposal (SCP) has been further refined after incorporating number of recommendations as have been emerged out of deliberations in the workshops of officers, experts conducted as per the following schedule:-

- (i) One week Workshop of officers from SMC, line Departments & experts in January 2017.
- (ii) One day Workshop held in the MoUD, GoI on 27<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2017 wherein the Commr./Secy. HUDD, Mission Director, Smart City Mission MoUD, GoI, Commissioners of SMC/JMC, associated officers of SMC/line Departments, experts from MoUD and M/s Voyants Consultants participated.
- (iii) One day National workshop on Centrally Sponsored Schemes of MoUD held in Vighyan Bhawan, New Delhi under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Union Minister Urban Development. This workshop was also attended by the Commissioner Secy. H&UDD and both the Commissioners of Municipal Corporation, Srinagar and Jammu.
- (iv) Two days workshop held in Jammu wherein Commr./Secy. H&UDD alongwith both the Commissioner of SMC and JMC, associated officers of Department, line Departments, Architects, sectoral experts and consultants participated.
- (v) Two days workshop held by the State H&UDD at "India Islamic Centre", New Delhi on 18-19 March 2017, wherein National Experts viz. (i) Sh. Pardeep Singh ISB, Mohali Retired IAS,(ii) Mr. Akshay Koul and (iii) Ms Gurmeet Rai Conservation Expert and other experts of INTACH have participated. The Commr./Secy. H&UDD, both the Commissioner's of SMC and JMC, associated officers and Consultants also participated.
- 4. The Commissioner /Secy. H&UDD once again highlighted that the approach & methodology for preparation of SCPs has been followed strictly in accordance with the guidelines of Govt. of India and the template of MoUD.
- 5. It was also brought to the notice of the Chair that State has already approved structure of State Advisory Council and Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) as per the broad guidelines of the MoUD in advance. Once the proposal gets through in Smart City Challenge-II (Round III), State will be in a position to take up the implementation of Smart City Proposals in motion.



The Commissioner/Secretary H&UDD made detailed presentations of 6. the improved smart city proposal for Srinagar City, including the financial plan, resource mobilization and SPV formation. The salient features of the proposal are given as under:-

- 9. The Committee after detailed project-wise discussion approved SCP of **Srinagar** and recommended its submission to the MoUD, Gol for participation in Stage-II (Round Three) of Smart City Challenge Competition.

Renewed Hope. The community supports the concept to build a tight urban core catalyzing places for people in a lively downtown business district.



- 3. The Commissioner/Secy. H&UDD informed that this meeting of SLHPSC has been convened to discuss improved Smart City Proposal (SCP) of **Srinagar City** which has already been discussed in the last meeting held on 13.12.2017. The Smart City Proposal (SCP) has been further refined after incorporating number of recommendations as have been emerged out of deliberations in the workshops of officers, experts conducted as per the following schedule:-

7. It was also informed that line Departments have already started mobilization of men & machinery as well as financial resources to implement

their projects proposed in the SCPs by incorporation of same in their Annual Action Plans.

- 8. Another issue regarding implementation of projects proposed in convergence mode came up for discussions. It was decided that in case of any financial constraints due to delay in funding, the respective Municipal Corporations will supplement resources from their own revenue resources /grants. By this way the time lines fixed for project implementation shall be assured without any impediments

#### Preliminary Human Resource Plan and Institutional Arrangement for Operationalization

A State Level Advisory Committee and a State Level High Powered Steering Committee will be constituted as provided in the Guidelines.

The City level SPV will be established as a Limited Company under the Companies Act, 2013. The equity shareholding will be held equally between the State Government and the ULB while ensuring that together they will hold no less than 51% of the total shareholding.


The SPV will be governed by a Board of Directors chaired by the Commissioner & Secretary Housing and Urban Development Department. The board will include nominee directors from the GoI and the ULB relevant departments of the GoJ&K as well as independent experts. At least one director will be a woman. The board will be assisted by a Company Secretary. The proposed membership of the Board is as follows

The operations of the SPV will be driven by a Chief Executive Officer (CEO) who will be a senior member of the State Government not below the rank of a Special Secretary of the Government of India. The CEO will be a full time appointee and will be identified by the Board of Directors and appointed with the approval of the state government.

The functions and responsibilities of the SPV will be as provided in the guidelines. A lean, flat organization manned by senior professionals will be established. On the other hand, external advisors, consultants, contractors and private sector partners will be deployed as required to undertake activities related to planning, designing, structuring and execution/construction etc. The senior professionals at the SPV will coordinate, oversee and monitor these service providers.

The organization structure proposed is as follows.



#### Strategic approval to Public Private Partnership - going beyond Financing

Public Private People Partnerships (PPP+) will form an essential and integral component of the implementation strategy under the Smart City Programme of Srinagar.

It is important to emphasize at the outset that we see PPP+ as much more than just a tool for attracting private capital for urban projects or meeting shortfalls in funds available with the public authorities. The financing role of PPP+ is important but not the primary objective of a PPP+ strategy.

Goals of the Public Private People Partnership (PPP+) Strategy: The PPP+ strategy of Srinagar will aim to provide the following positive outcomes.

- 1. <u>Citizen Led Development:</u> The PPP+ strategy will seek to create a sustained, continuous and supportive involvement of the citizens of Srinagar in the visioning, planning, designing, implementation as well as monitoring of the portfolio of projects under the Smart City programme. It will seek to ensure that regular communication takes place with the people of Srinagar, particularly its youth, in a structured and professional manner. This will ensure the buy-in of the people and that the Smart City programme reflects the aspirations and creativity of the citizens of Srinagar.
- 2. Access to Private Sector Efficiencies: The PPP+ strategy will, of course, seek to provide access to private sector enterprise, efficiencies, technology, commercial discipline, superior management and marketing prowess. For this purpose, the PPP+ strategy will not be limited only to commercially viable projects such as well-located hotel projects. A PPP strategy can be attempted, for example, even for restaurants in remote locations with low foot-fall or for the adaptive reuse of heritage destinations such as the silk factory or for nurturing a vibrant "home-stay" programme for tourists. Private sector involvement in such desirable but "commercially unviable" projects will be achieved by making them attractive to the private sector by providing government subsidy support as "Viability Gap Funding". The important thing is to ensure that the private sector stakeholders have "skin in the game", are properly incentivized to provide efficient outcomes, and are selected in a fair manner.
- 3. Focus on Local Entrepreneurs and Talent: The PPP+ strategy will also aim at encouraging and mainstreaming local entrepreneurs through the smart city project opportunities. The PPP process will have focus on local talent particularly the local youth. Capacity building programmes in different business, operational, and creative components of the Smart City Projects will form an important part of the PPP+ strategy to enable the local youth and entrepreneurs to participate.
- 4. <u>Linkages with businesses and expertise from outside the state</u>: At the same time the PPP+ strategy will also attempt to create a welcoming environment to attract expertise, business interest, technologies and capital from outside the state to Srinagar. It is also hoped that in due course this will enhance the capacities available within the state and will also give rise to partnerships and linkages between local businesses and outside parties.
- 5. <u>Private Capital:</u> Last, but not the least, the PPP+ strategy will, of course, aim at the more familiar objective of PPP i.e. access to private capital to augment government resources.

# 4.4 PPP – Strategic Approval to Public Private Partnership – going beyond financing

**Implementation of the PPP+ Strategy:** To enable a PPP+ strategy as outlined above to be rolled out as part of the Smart City Programme suitable enabling environment will be created. This will have the following components.

- Policy Frameworks, Executive Orders, Legislative Action: Relevant policies as required will be framed to deal with issues such as selection of appropriate PPP strategy, Procurement and Tendering practices, Financing Arrangements, Viability Gap Funding etc. Executive orders to create and implement these policies will be issued. In rare cases legislative action may become necessary.
- 2. <u>Institutional Arrangements:</u> To translate the PPP+ strategy into action suitable institutional arrangements will be created. The institutional arrangements will include
  - a) Special Purpose Vehicle for Smart City Programme (SPV): The SPV will draw upon senior government and private sector experts to serve as employees of the SPV. The SPV will be led by a Board of Directors consisting of senior government officials and private sector experts. The CEO will be a senior member of the Government. The SPV could also have an Executive or Non-Executive Chairman who is an expert of repute in infrastructure and urban development. The Smart City SPV will lead and orchestrate the diverse projects and interventions under the Smart City Programme. It will also act as the financial "balancing reservoir": it will blend revenue surplus projects together with revenue deficit projects in both PPP and government formats. It will combine the Smart City Funds, Convergence Project Funds, and the PPP Funds to balance the budget.
  - b) <u>Steering Committee:</u> The Steering Committee will be chaired by the Chief Minister and will have very senior level presence from the offices/departments of Finance, Urban Development, Tourism, and Culture as well as Financial Institutions, particularly, the J&K Bank and other independent experts.
  - c) Advisors/Advisory Board: This will consist of top quality experts drawn from the government/private sector and civil society who will play an active role in guiding the programme.
  - d) <u>Consultants:</u> The SPV will, on a need basis, hire high quality Technical, Financial, and Environmental and Social, and Legal Consultants as required.
  - e) A Project Development and Promotion Cell (PDPC): This cell will be dedicated to Project Preparation, preparation of Feasibility Studies, Contractual and Concession structures, Tendering Process management, Selection of Private Sector Partners etc. The PDPC will service the SPV for performance of these important tasks.
- 3. <u>Platform for Citizen Engagement</u>: A robust platform will be established within the SPV to engage with the citizens of Srinagar as part of the Public Private People Strategy as described above.



- 2. In order to receive fund under the scheme, utility shall open separate dedicated bank account in a nationalized bank having e-banking facility. The nature of the PMRP account shall be Current Account with CLTD (Corporate Liquid Term Deposit) facility.





Minutes of meeting of the Approval Committee chaired by Secretary (FPI) held on 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2016 at 3:30 P.M. to consider proposals under the scheme for Setting up / Modernization of Abattoir.

The following proposals under the scheme for setting up / modernization of abattoirs were considered:

- Approval for change in Implementing Agency, Project Location, Grant amount and timeline for (11<sup>th</sup> Plan) abattoir project at Srinagar, J&K.
- 2. Ratification/ Approval for change in the project site and extension of the time line for completion of abattoir project at Faridabad.
- Ratification/ Approval for extension for timeline for completion of abattoir project at Ranchi.
- Ratification/ Approval for extension for timeline for completion of abattoir project at Edayar, Kerala.
- 5. Ratification/Approval for extension of time line for completion of abattoir project at Goa.
- 6. Final Approval of abattoir project at Bareilly.
- 7. Final Approval of abattoir project at Aurangabad.

The list of participants is annexed.

Secretary, FPI, Chairman of the Committee welcomed the Committee members and the other participants. Shri, Parag Gupta, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Food Processing Industries, presented the proposals. The gist of discussions and the decision are brought out in succeeding paras.

### 1. Jammu & Kashmir:

Approval for (a) change in the Project implementing Agency from J&K SSPB to SMC, (b) change in the site of the project from Wanihama to Aloochi Bagh and (c) change in the grant amount from Rs. 1410 lakh to Rs. 1500 lakh for abattoir project at Srinagar, J&K.

- 1.1 The project is for establishment of modern abattoir at Srinagar, by Srinagar Municipal Corporation, Srinagar with capacity of Goat/Sheep 5000 per day. The total project cost is Rs. 2452.36 lakh.
- 1.2 Shri H.H. Dutt, Joint Director H&UD, Government of J&K, Dr. Javed Ahmed, veterinary Officer, Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC) and Shri Rakesh Shanglow, Financial Advisor, J&K Sheep and Sheep Products Development Board (J&K SSPDB) attended the meeting. The Committee was informed that during 2008, the instant abattoir project was approved by the

Approval Committee and was to be implemented by J&K SSPDB but due to various reapproject could not be implemented by the Board and hence, Government of J&K decided to the implementing agency and site of the project to Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC, Aloochi Bagh respectively. The original project cost was Rs. 2800 lakh and the eligible cost calculation of grant-in-aid was Rs. 1879.49 lakh. Thus the total grant-in-aid approved at that time was Rs. 1410 lakh (75% of Rs. 1879.49 lakh).

- 1.3 It was informed that the change in site has led to change in lay out of the project without change in capacity i.e. 5000 Sheep per day and reduced project cost. The revised project cost as submitted by Government of J&K /SMC is Rs. 2452.36 lakh but the eligible cost for calculation of grant-in-aid has increased to Rs. 2211.57 lakh thereby bringing-out the grant amount to Rs. 1658.67 lakh (75% of the eligible cost). The grant will however have to be restricted to Rs. 1500 lakh which is the maximum permissible amount as per the scheme guidelines.
- 1.4 It was also informed that the title of land identified for the abattoir project is with Srinagar Municipal Corporation and there is no other issue like public objection etc., with the land and project. The land is 10 kilometre away from Srinagar city and there is no problem in transportation of carcass to the city from the proposed abattoir. During discussion, JS&FA, MoFPI clarified that as both the institution i.e. J&K SSPDB and SMC are under the same State Government, the grant already released to J&K SSPDB may be transferred to SMC account by the State Government.
- 1.5 The Approval Committee approved (a) change in the Project implementing Agency from J&K SSPB to SMC, (b) change in the site of the project from Wanihama to Aloochi Bagh and (c) change in the grant amount from Rs. 1410 lakh to Rs. 1500 lakh to be given in four instalments subject to standard conditions and scheme guidelines. The project tenure will be as per the guidelines issued on 09.09.2008 with project period as 18 months (this is 11<sup>th</sup> plan project). Thus this project is required to be completed by 26.04.2018. However the pattern of release of grant will be as per revised guidelines dated 25.11.2013. The break-up of the approved grant is as under:

#### 2. Haryana:

Ratification/ Approval for change in the project site and extension in project period of abattoir project at Faridabad.

- 2.1 This relates to the ratification of the Approval Committee for change in the project site and extension in time line of the abattoir project at Faridabad.
- Shri O.P. Goyal Chief Engineer, Municipal Corporation Faridabad attended the meeting. He informed that they have floated the tender for selection of Turnkey contractor and will complete the project within the approved time frame on the newly identified site.
- 2.2 The Approval Committee ratified the change of site of the project from Sector 22, Faridabad to Village Jharsaintly, Tehsil Ballabhgarh, Sector 57, Industrial Area, District, Faridabad. As the change in site of the project was conveyed to MCF vide letter dated19.05.2016 (after on file approval for change in site of the project), the project period has also been revised to 24 months from 05.05.2016 and upto 04.05.2018.

# 3. Jharkhand:

Ratification/ Approval for extension for timeline for completion of abattoir project at Ranchi.

- 3.1 This relates to the ratification of the Approval Committee for implementing the project of Ranchi Municipal Corporation, Ranchi beyond 18 months (Implementation schedule is 18 months as per 11<sup>th</sup> Plan guidelines of the Scheme) for establishment of modern abattoir of sheep and goat at Kanke, Ranchi, Jharkhand.
- 3.2 Shri Prashant Kumar, Municipal Commissioner, Ranchi Municipal Corporation attended the meeting. He informed that the project is progressing will Ranchi Municipal Corporation (RMC) has terminated the PMC due to non-performance and is in advanced stage of appointment of new PMC. He assured that they will submit the documents for release of 3<sup>rd</sup> instalment by end of November, 2016. He requested for extension of timeline of the project up to 31.03.2017.
- 3.3 After detailed deliberation, the Approval Committee approved the extension in time line of the project up to 31.03.2017.

#### 4. Kerala:

Ratification/Approval for extension for timeline for completion of abattoir project at Edayar, Kerala.

4.1 The project of M/s Meat Products of India Limited (MPIL), Kerala for establishment of modern abattoir of large and small animals at Edayar, Koothattukulam was approved by Approval

Committee on 08.04.2013 for grant-in-aid of Rs. 1436.12 lakh. The project has exceptional stipulated time period for implementation schedule i.e. 08.10.2014.

- 4.2 Dr. Saji E., General Manager attended the meeting. He informed that the project achieved major milestones and due to procedural issues there is delay in release of funds from State Government and Rural Infrastructure Development Fund (NABARD) for which Secretary, DAHD, Govt. of Kerala assured that they are working on it and will get it shortly, Approval Committee may consider extension of timeline of the project period for completion of the modern abattoir in Edayar, Kerala up to 28.02.2017.
- 4.3 After deliberation, the Approval Committee approved extension of timeline of the project period for completion of the modern abattoir in Edayar, Kerala <u>up to 31.01.2017.</u>

## 5. Goa:

Ratification/Approval for extension of time line for completion of abattoir project at Usgaon, Goa.

- 5.1 This relates to the ratification of the Approval Committee for implementing the project of Goa Meat Complex, Goa beyond 18 months (Implementation schedule is 18 months as per guidelines of the Scheme dated 07.05.2013) for establishment of modern abattoir at Usgaon, Goa. The case was examined on file and accordingly Secretary FPI had accorded approval for extension of project period up to 31.05.2016 subject to getting it ratified by Approval Committee.
- 5.2 GMCL has completed and commissioned the project on 31.05.2016 and put same on commercial operation. GMCL has also submitted all the necessary documents for release of 4th and final instalment vide letter dated 31.05.2016 and accordingly after concurrence of IFD and with the approval of Secretary, FPI, 4<sup>th</sup> instalment of grant (Rs. 1.23512 crore) had been released on dated 12.09.2016.
- 5.3 After detailed deliberation, the Approval Committee ratified the extension in time line of the project up to 31.05.2016.

#### 6. Uttar Pradesh:

Final Approval of abattoir project at Bareilly. (PPP project)

- 6.1 The proposal was considered by the Approval Committee of Ministry of Food Processing Industries which met on 18-12-2013 and the Committee accorded "in-principle" approval to the grant of financial assistance in the form of grant-in-aid to a maximum of Rs. 1010.50 lakhs for the project subject to the standard conditions/guidelines of the scheme. The "in- principle" approval letter in this regard was issued by the Ministry vide letter dated 02-01-2014.
- 6.2 Nagar Nigam Bareilly (NNB) vide letter dated 18.12.2015 conveyed selection of PPP partner and the final grant. NNB informed that Government of U.P, vide letter dated 11<sup>th</sup> December, 2015 informed that M/s. Marya Frozen Agro Foods Private Limited has been selected as the PPP partner with the approval of the Governor of the State of U.P and that it has also been mentioned in their Bid that they are not taking any grant for the project. Further, it was stated that Nagar Nigam Bareilly will provide the requisite administrative support to the selected Bidder after

Minutes of the meeting held on 09.03.2017, under the chairmanship of Commissioner/Secretary to Government H&UDD to discuss and explore the avenues for Revenue Enhancement of the Urban Local Bodies including Municipal Corporations of Jammu & Srinagar.

The following Officers participated:

- 1) Commissioner Municipal Corporation, Jammu
- 2) Director Urban Local Bodies, Jammu
- 3) Commissioner Municipal Corporation, Srinagar
- 4) Director Finance H& UDD.
- 5) Additional Secretary to Govt. H& UDD
- 6) Joint Director (P&S) H& UDD.
- 7) Chief Accounts Officer, JMC
- 8) Chief Accounts Officer, SMC
- 9) Chief Town Planner, JMC

At the outset the Commissioner Secretary had detailed feedback from both the Commissioners of Municipal Corporations as well as from the Directors of Urban Local Bodies of the State regarding different head of Revenue generation viz-a-viz realization in the existing set up. Both the Commissioners submitted that due to non-holding of Municipal Elections in J&K since last 7 years, the Gol did not sanction any grants under 13<sup>th</sup> /14<sup>th</sup> FC Awards as a result of which the State is providing Grant-in-Aid/Capex Budget for creation of civic amenities in the urban areas as well as to meet out other recurring expenditure of ULBs.

Now, due to inclusion of both the capital cities under AMRUT since 2015-16, resources have been augmented to take up different reforms being carried out for creation of basic amenities and upliftment of living standards. However, there are certain areas which have potential for Revenue generation and need to be tapped viz., imposition of property tax suspended since April 2003, enhancement of user charges, land monetization, value captive financing, floating of municipal bonds and enforcement in recovery of revenue arrears etc.

The Commissioner/Secy. H&UDD also underlined need for putting in best efforts to enhance revenue generation in the capital cities of Jammu & Srinagar as same has been mandated to get the different identified projects prioritized in the **Smart City Proposals** prepared by both the Corporations for supplementing resource gap in convergence to ensure their timely completion.

After detailed discussions the following interventions for enhancing the revenues were stressed in a time bound manner:-

- Commissioner, JMC informed that for Land Monetization EOI for Transaction Advisory Services is being floated for the land banks available with the Municipal Corporation. Commissioner /Secretary, H&UDD desired that similar action should also be initiated by SMC.
- 2) In order to mobilize resources Local Bodies shall also initiate modern technique and best practices in the country like allocation of tradable FAR/FSI.
- 3) Additional resource mobilization shall be carried out through public amenities such as Parking lots, public conveniences, imposition of betterment levy on the assets created by the Corporations/Urban Local Bodies in their jurisdictional areas.
- 4) The sanitation services being provided by the Corporations/Urban Local Bodies will be broad based further and 100% door to door collection shall be ensured by improving the recovery mechanism. This mechanism shall also be placed at suitable locations in the commercial/institutional and upcoming developing colonies in the Municipal limits.
- 5) It was informed that sewer trunks within the Corporation limits have been partially laid and households are being connected with these trunks. Sewerage Charges shall also be collected from the households thereby making substantial additional municipal revenue.
- The Govt. is at the threshold point to finalize the policy of regularization of unauthorized constructions within the respective Municipal Corporation/ULB limits subject to fulfilment of certain criteria for imposing penalties and regularization on case to case basis. It is expected that this step will generate huge amount of revenue for the Corporations/Urban Local Bodies and shall help substantially in improving their financial health.

- 7) The tax structure for informal sector i.e. Koisks, Mini Shop, Reharies (hand carts) and other commercial vending activities shall be re-evaluated and rationalized revenue realization shall be ensured.
- Property tax which used to be levied earlier and has been done away with since 2003 needs to be revived. It was decided that the department shall formulate a proposal for re-imposition of the Tax, so that the Corporations/Urban Local Bodies are able to gather more revenue.
- 9) The practice of Urban agriculture as an additional source of income for Local Bodies was also discussed and it was conveyed that plantations of fruit bearing trees and horticulture on profitable scale shall be carried out by Corporations/Urban Local Bodies zones on contract basis for a harvest and sale in the urban areas having developed Fruit and Vegetable Markets for financial consideration which will rake in more revenues.
- 10) Commissioner, JMC informed that for Land Monetization EOI for Transaction Advisory Services is being floated for the land banks available with the Municipal Corporation. Commissioner /Secretary, H&UDD desired that similar action should also be initiated by SMC.
- 11) It was informed that agency for Credit Rating of AMRUT Cities have been engaged by H&UDD which will help the Corporations in floating of Municipal Bonds by credit rating thereby generating additional revenue resources.
- 12) The Commissioner/Secretary also deliberated in detail and stressed for taking proactive measures to explore and identify the other sources which would contribute in greater resource mobilization for the Corporations/Urban Local Bodies to make these financially self-reliant.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.


